- X-rays
- Radiation (radium and isotope) therapy including technician materials and supplies
- Surgical supplies, such as dressings
- Splints, casts and other devices used to reduce fractures and dislocations
- Laboratory tests
- Blood including storage and administration. Coverage of whole blood and packed red cells begins only with the fourth pint of blood that you need you must either pay the costs for the first 3 pints of blood you get in a calendar year or have the blood donated by you or someone else. All other components of blood are covered beginning with the first pint used
- Other outpatient diagnostic tests

Prior authorization may be required for some services, including but not limited to genetic testing, CT Scans, MRIs, PET/Nuclear Medicine, Intensity Modulated Radiation Therapy and other select services. Prior authorization does not apply to x-ray services.

### Hearing Services, Medicare-covered

Coverage is provided for diagnostic Medicare-covered hearing and balance evaluations to determine if you need medical treatment. Hearing Aids are limited to one per ear per year and includes follow-up visits for fittings and adjustments for the first year following the purchase of a hearing aid, a 60 day trial period, a 3-year extended warranty, and 80 batteries per hearing aid for non-rechargeable models. The selection is limited to TruHearing Advanced and Premium Hearing Aids.

Coverage Gap  Most Medicare drug plans have a coverage gap (also called the "donut hole"). This means there's a temporary change in what you will pay for your drugs. The coverage gap begins after the total yearly drug cost (including what our plan has paid and what you have paid) reaches \$5,030.  After you enter the coverage gap, you pay 25% of the plan's cost for covered generic and brand name drugs until your costs total \$8,000 which is the end of the coverage gap. Not everyone will enter the coverage gap.	25% coinsurance up to a maximum of \$8,000 (combined with what the member and the Plan pays)

Understanding the Benefits	
	The Evidence of Coverage (EOC) provides a complete list of all coverage and services. It's important to review plan coverage, cost and benefits before you enroll. Visit wellsense.org/medicare or call 800-967-4497 (TTY: 711) to view a copy of the EOC.
	Review the provider directory (or ask your doctor) to make sure the doctors you see now are in the network. If they are not listed, it means you will likely have to select a new doctor.
	Review the pharmacy directory to make sure the pharmacy you use for any prescription medicines is in the network. If the pharmacy is not listed, you will likely have to select a new pharmacy for your prescriptions.
	Review the formulary to make sure your drugs are covered.
Understanding Important Rules	
	<b>Effect on current coverage:</b> If you are currently enrolled in a Medicare Advantage plan, your current Medicare Advantage healthcare coverage will end once your new Medicare Advantage coverage starts. If you have Tricare, your coverage may be affected once your new Medicare Advantage coverage starts. Please contact Tricare for more information. If you have a Medigap plan, once your Medicare Advantage coverage starts, you may want to drop your Medigap policy because you will be paying for coverage you cannot use.
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	plan, your current Medicare Advantage healthcare coverage will end once your new Medicare Advantage coverage starts. If you have Tricare, your coverage may be affected once your new Medicare Advantage coverage starts. Please contact Tricare for more information. If you have a Medigap plan, once your Medicare Advantage coverage starts, you may want to drop your Medigap policy because you will be paying for coverage you cannot use.  In addition to your monthly premium, you must continue to pay your Medicare Part B premium. This premium is normally taken out of your Social Security check each month. If you enroll in a plan with a Part B buy-down, you may pay less for your Medicare Part B
